

Grounds Report



December 11, 2017

Before I begin with a report I would like to express my “thank you” to the current board members! Without your positive support we couldn’t have accomplished the changes in our community. Remember when we all attended our Community Association Certification Meeting and a reputable attorney spoke to us, Dan Lobeck...His first comment to the audience was ***“It is your responsibility to improve the value of your community. You have been elected to carry out many responsibilities but this is foremost.”*** And with that comment I

would like to take you on a journey with me.

Some people tell me “I have had pixie dust” when presenting some ideas for this community! But hey...don’t we tell our children growing up...”believe, plan and don’t stop dreaming to make things better, you can do it”...Again I am reminded of the day I spoke with a resident here about the ugliness of the grounds and she respectfully said.. “If you don’t like it then get on a committee and make changes”...I thank her for that comment. She may have regretted it from time to time as my committee and I began to become “visionaries” of “what could be” and how to do it without changing our association fees!! My goodness years ago we obtained a “Neighborhood Grant” never accomplished before to change the landscape...then moved on with consulting contractors and between their vision and ours we have changed this little community! You can’t help but notice the changes...

Landscape Enhancement: First let me say...we have had obstacles and there are cinch bugs and there are areas that need additional attention and we will continue to move forward. Living things need to be attended time and again...however lets be grateful for the overall project affect...people drive in here and make comments how lovely the grounds look...We have stayed on point 5 year plan...73 villas completed per year, front irrigation, plants, mulch and sod. So far we have completed 219 villas plus additional few on C street, total of 229 villas and not even counting the corners. Two years remaining to finalize the fronts of villas. PLEASE remember...not to add to these plantings. This is ***common ground*** and we are striving to improve and keep costs stable for years in the future without maintenance expenses for trimming etc.

Oh and not to mention...two tropical storms, and a hurricane. We lost 122 jatropa trees which need to be replaced. Clean up happened within the week when most areas of the County are still clearing debris that the residents had ***to do themselves***. We were lucky and coordinated the clean up with Bloomings. Clean Cut tree came in twice to trim large trees...before the hurricane was even anticipated and now need to return to finish the 3rd go around.

Take a ride with me today: Let’s start at the entrance off Constitution ...first look at the palm trees, the plants surrounding the Clubhouse. The additional lamp posts reflecting a pineapple welcoming residents! The white fence added around the pool pump, the new signage at the bulletin board and all the stop signs with new white posts. Thank you Shawn and Bill for these clean additions. And not to mention the new white fences they have installed in key holes! Turning onto Riverbluff Parkway the addition of irrigation, grass and plantings we have improved from the straw like plantings in the areas all the way to and from the back and now are moving to the side streets. Fencing surrounding the entire property, including the dumpster area. A new lift station at the back area installed by the county but the fencing and plantings were installed by SRV.

Yes, do we have more to do.. Absolutely...fixing areas are still on the agenda. The goal will continue to be making it the best it can be for all.

Another positive note... we have worked to monitor our irrigation billing and consumption of the water. Throughout the past year we have received substantial adjustments due to our monitoring and request to the county. My team of Don Puls, Jerry McDermott, Nan and Shawn joined Chris a plumber from Badger Bob’s and Bloomings Irrigation Manager to meet with the County Manager three times this year. Through those discussions in our meetings we have determined we have the best method and most cost effective for the community. We also have received, through much investigating and documentation...another \$8,000 credit in the last water billing! A total of \$25,000 approximately of water bill adjustments because we worked on it! An example of a leak recently...two toilets were constantly running. A “caregiver” found these and reported it to the office. Shawn made the repair. Those two toilets running constantly resulted in an adjustment when we documented it to the county...of \$3,000. So please note... if you have leaking toilets, faucets and outside areas on your hoses, in your laundry rooms...report them to the office and FIX THEM! You are costing the association much money!

I am proud of the work my Grounds team has done to make this a better place. They have worked on ideas and solutions that will be implemented with the new Grounds team. The most fun we had was to end this year with our Christmas Tree Lighting. Margaret and Don Quitter, Pat and Kathy Garthwaite, Bob Robbins, Kathryn Hallisey, Roberta Chandley, Ceil Cooper Andrew Nyce and CHET DRAKE..our lighting technician and Shawn for the help and the SLEIGH.

Thank you all for your support, the fun, the laughs the tears and the hard work! I am proud to have been your Grounds Director.

I wish the new Board members much success in their endeavors for the next two years!

Sales & Rentals Orientation Committee Report

Note:

- Contact Nan at the office if you are interested in renting your villa. She'll let you know if there is availability, or if you will be added to the wait list
- Prior to renting, you'll need to submit a Request-To-Lease form to the office for approval. This procedure also applies to owners of Exempt villas. Forms can be picked up at the office. Please see Nan with any questions

Important Rental Procedures for Owners:

- Ensure that *new leases are fully executed and received by the Office prior to the current lease expiring*
- It is the owners' responsibility to ensure that a current lease is always on file for all rentals at all times
- If leases are not received by the office prior to the current lease expiring, owners will lose their rental position and be placed at the bottom of the Owners' Wait-List. This means that you have lost your rental privileges and cannot rent your property at this time
- Owners on the Owners-Wait-List will move up

Suggestions Prior to Renting:

- Owners should provide a neat, clean and bug-free environment
- Blinds, rods and window dressings must be in perfect working order
- For seasonal renters, please be sure your kitchen is a full functioning kitchen with dishes, pots, pans, glasses, flatware, can openers, toaster, etc.
- Clean bedding (comforters, pillows) and sheets that fit your beds
- Unfrayed towels and face cloths
- Working TV(s)
- Clean carpets and floors
- Fixtures in perfect working order
- Store all of your personal items and breakable table decorations
- Hiring a housekeeping service to clean your villa prior to your renter's arrival is a very reasonable expectation

You may obtain a helpful list of what your home should include when preparing to rent it. See Nan for a copy.

Other Matters:

- Outside persons interested in purchasing villas, or villas acquired through inheritance, quit claim deed, etc., must go through Orientation prior to purchase or transfer, since all transactions require board approval. SRV's Application for Approval to Purchase or Transfer must be submitted to the office.
- Current SRV owners, purchasing another villa, must submit an Application for Approval to Purchase to the office. Board approval is required though no Orientation or fee is required.
- It has been the custom of many residents to leave their villa and laundry room keys with the office. These are the only keys that the office needs (in case of emergency while you are away) so all others will be returned to you. At your earliest convenience, please stop by the office to see Nan between 9am & 1pm to check the keys the office has on file for your home.

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
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

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
