



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March 2025 President's Report

It's been a very busy 2025 so far and we don't expect things to slow down.

Others on the Board are providing additional details, but so far we are dealing with the following:

- Milton claim frustration – as we are all aware, Citizens is only paying for repairs this time where they paid replacement cost last time. This is their right and the policy we have had with them for a couple of years has not changed.
- The Ian claim is now officially a lawsuit against Citizens Insurance.
- The rules and regulations are being updated and will be presented to all when completed.
- New trash carts have been a huge topic of conversation and I have included additional information on them within this newsletter.
- Thanks to Jennifer Royer being our new treasurer and Jerry McDermott being assistant treasurer and providing history. We are focusing very hard on getting all of our accounting questions answered and changing accounts where necessary. We are also requiring all bank statements and invoices come directly to our address rather than going to Real Manage. There have been too many delays and we can't condone that in the future.
- I've also included information from Resilient SRQ (the County's program for Milton Recovery). The county commissions have currently allocated \$75,000,000 to dredge Phillippi Creek. If this ends up passing, it will be a huge benefit to the community as well as to SRV.
- The new directory is coming soon.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

- B. Special Board of Directors Meeting, December 4, 2024, ***Marcia Drake-Lawson made a motion to table minutes, seconded by Julie Micheletti, all in favor, motion passed.***
- C. Board of Directors Organizational Meeting, December 19, 2024, ***Jerry McDermott made a motion to not approve meeting minutes due to correction needing to be made to include Board Member Terms, seconded by Julie Micheletti, all in favor, motion passed.***
- D. Board of Directors Meeting, December 19, 2024, ***Larry Gill motioned for approval of minutes, seconded by Julie Micheletti, all in favor, motioned passed.***

Each Board Member introduced themselves and shared a brief description of themselves and experiences.

Presidents Report: Marcia Drake- Lawson, President’s report attached.

Treasurers Report: Jennifer Royer briefly spoke about modifications to the 2023 Audit that need to be corrected. Can not discuss the 2024 Year End Financial Reports until corrections are made to the 2023 audit.

Community Association report: Sarah Daley, CAM report attached.

Building Report: Mitch Wyant briefly spoke about the repair of the perimeter fence that was damaged due to Hurricane Milton. One proposal was received from Sarasota Fence in the amount of \$48,500.00 that was previously discussed at a prior Board Meeting. Mitch Wyant will be obtaining another proposal for repairs of the fence.

Clubhouse Report: Roland Miles discussed a control access entry that would allow the clubhouse doors and pool area to operate on a key fob or card badge system. Roland will be looking into this further with quotes from vendors.

Friendly Feud, grand prize was \$500.00 as well as audience prizes.

Grounds Report: Mike Cavallo briefly spoke about the needs of the SRV Community regarding sod replacement, plants, weeding, trimming and pruning. He wants to bring back the beauty to SRV.

A. Hurricane Milton Status –

Paul Woodward, ABC, and Ron Cooper, Public Adjuster to walk the SRV Community to see if there are any small items that they identified during the walk. Additionally, the focus will be on addressing smaller items such as shutters and other minor repairs. The aim is to ensure that all aspects of the SRV Community are maintained.

Citizens Insurance Company will be repairing roofs rather than replacing them, in response to the damage caused by Hurricane Milton. This is a departure from their approach after Hurricane Ian, where they covered full replacement costs. The decision was based on assessments of the extent of the damage and the recommendations of the inspection teams.

ABC will be replacing drip edges that were damaged during Hurricane Milton with thicker gauged metal, clips will be replaced with screws and grommets.

New Business:

A. Villa 267 – Modification Form to Replace Nonexistent Mulch with Grass, ***Mitch Wyant made a motion to approve, seconded by Roland Miles, all in favor, motion passed.***

B. Upgrade Sound System in Clubhouse - ***Mitch Wyant made a motion to upgrade the sound system in the clubhouse not to exceed \$523.00 which will be charged to the clubhouse reserve fund, seconded by Jennifer Royer, all in favor, motion passed.***

C. Approval of 2025 Committees – ***Marcia Drake-Lawson made a motion to approve the 2025 Committees, seconded by Jerry McDermott, all in favor, motion passed.***

Adjournment: ***Jerry McDermott made a motion to adjourn meeting, second by Roland Miles, all in favor, meeting adjourned.***

Safety & Security Report February 2025

Safety and Security is pleased to report that activity needing the Safety & Security committee's attention has slowed this month.

While we still have had a young man trespassing to fish in our marina one time in February, the Safety & Security committee has had very few other calls.

We are also very happy to report that our community perimeter fencing repair has begun. Safety & Security has always believed that having our fencing repaired will be the best action we can take to protect SRV from uninvited people on our property.

We still have multiple infractions of our Rules and Regulations within SRV, all of which are being reviewed and owners will be notified to correct these. On a side note, the Rules and Regulations Committee, that is reviewing and updating our Rules and Regulations, has had their first meeting and will continue meeting until they have examined all the current Rules and put together their recommendations for the Board of Directors to consider.

Also, Safety and Security is working with Buildings to begin repairs on the wire fence barricade along the top of our seawall, much of which was damaged in the recent storms or has fallen into disrepair due to age and neglect. This project will start with the Marina area as the first section to be repaired. This project will continue along our entire seawall as time and funding permits. We hope that all our owners and residents feel safe and secure in our retirement community.

There always seems that there is a small number of disruptive behaviors occurring and rules being broken or not followed and we are working on getting compliance to these problems.

If you have any questions if what you are doing or what you see happening in SRV, please review our Rules & Regulations for guidance. Please contact the office, me or a member of the Safety and Security committee to report Rule infractions and / or to get a question answered. Thank You.

Important changes to solid waste collection services

- **Transition Date:** March 28 is the last collection day with the current service provider.
- **New Garbage Carts:** Sarasota County will provide one garbage cart to each Class I residence in unincorporated Sarasota County.
- **Automated Collection:** All garbage must fit inside the new cart for collection. Items left outside the cart will no longer be collected after March 29.
- **Bulk Pickups:** Each Class I residential property is eligible for four free bulk pickups (up to 10 cubic yards) per calendar year with the option to request additional bulk collection services (supplemental collection fees apply). Requests for bulk pickups must be scheduled in advance with the service provider.
- **Additional Carts:** Additional carts (both garbage and recycling) may be requested through your service provider beginning March 31. Supplemental fees will apply.
- **Cart Size Exchange:** Cart size exchanges will be available after July 1. More information will be posted in June.

Service providers, collection day and service areas

- **Service Providers:** [Waste Pro of Florida, Inc.](#) will collect residential garbage, recycling and yard waste in the Solid Waste North Service Area and [FCC Environmental Services of Florida LLC](#) will collect residential garbage, recycling and yard waste in the Solid Waste South Service Area.
- **Service Day Changes:** Many residents will have a [new collection day](#) beginning March 31.
- **Same Day Collection:** Garbage, recycling and yard waste will continue to be collected on one day.
- **Recycling:** There are no changes to recycling. Continue using your blue recycling cart and follow current disposal guidelines. **No plastic bags are allowed.**
- **Yard Waste:** There are no changes to yard waste. Follow the same disposal guidelines as before. **No plastic bags are allowed.**

Resilient SRQ will incorporate board direction and release the draft action plan for public review and comment on **Monday, March 3** at 2024storms.resilientsrq.net/action-plan.

Privacy Fencing for Trash/Recycling Rolling Bins
Report for Board Meeting
February 27, 2025

1. Two Motions were passed at the February 27, 2020, Board Meeting (5 years ago) to allow privacy fencing to be installed for the purpose of hiding the blue recycling rolling bins that SRV owners received from the county.

2. The first motion was: ***Motion to permit Villa Owners to install privacy fencing at owner's expense. All county permits and underground utility location services will be the owner's responsibility. Fencing installation, materials, location, and size to be done under the approval and supervision of the SRV Building Committee. Villa owner's would be responsible for removing any plants and preparing the ground in the fencing area location. Current low bids for single L-shaped fencing are \$215. Current low bid for single Straight sections of fencing is \$120.00. Fencing would be the owner's responsibility to maintain and clean.***

**In 2020 the Board obtained bids to put fencing up at each Villa. The Motion to approve \$40,000.00 for this project did not pass.


3. A second motion was passed that stated: ***Privacy fencing for the purpose of blocking the sight of recycle bin or the trash can is permitted for individual units and are exempt from this rule – Section VII Villa Activities [O]***

4. Section VII Villa Activities [O] states: All ***condominium Units MUST remain of like exterior design, shape, color and appearance as the other Condominium Units of the same class or type.***

**It is apparent that this motion and language was never added to our Rules - but will be included in the updated version now under review.

5. I was asked to speak on this subject today because I built a privacy fence enclosure at my Villa #248 for the purpose of hiding my new 65-gallon trash that cannot fit into my trash closet and I did not want to put it inside my laundry room. The language of the 2020 motion made it clear that any owner building a privacy fence must do so under the supervision of the Building Committee. I submitted a "Modification Request" to the SRV office with the description of the project and a drawing of the enclosure. I did not start work until the Building Committee approved the project. Also, in my case Mitch stopped by during the construction to see the project. Although not in the motion, back in 2020 it was understood that the fence enclosure would be white in color and of a solid material. I made my fencing 47"H x 36"D x 40"W. This was sufficient for the 65-gallon size. I also put Paver Stones down level with the carport floor as a base. I built my enclosure at the street end of my villa between the Villa and Carport. I built this myself and my total cost was approx. \$150.00. Larry Gill
